

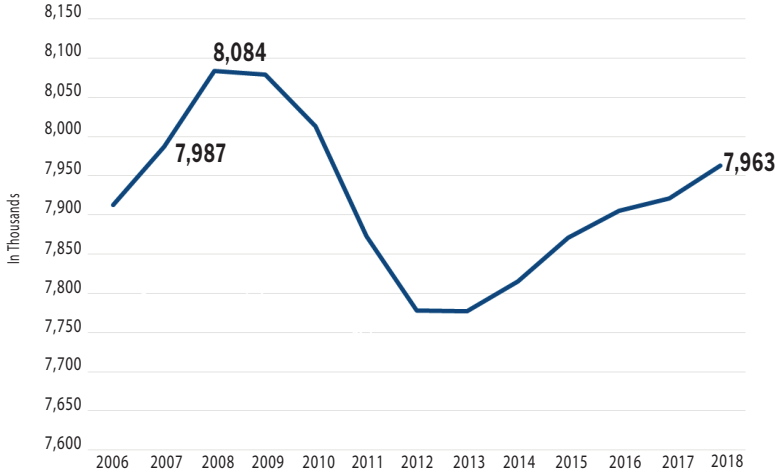
# K-12 PUBLIC WORKFORCE PROFILE

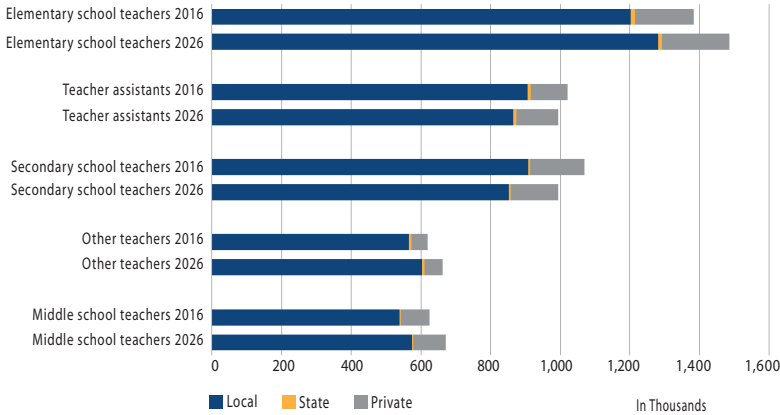

## LOCAL GOVERNMENT EDUCATION WORKFORCE



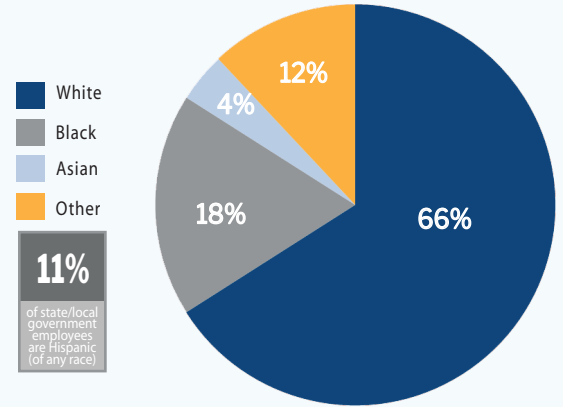

## K-12 EMPLOYMENT PROJECTIONS



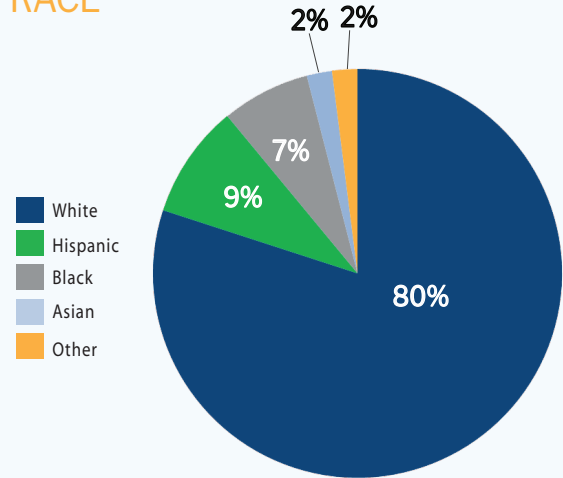

## TOTAL STATE AND LOCAL WORKFORCE BY RACE



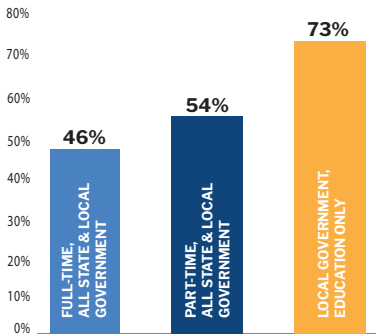

## PUBLIC SCHOOL TEACHERS BY RACE



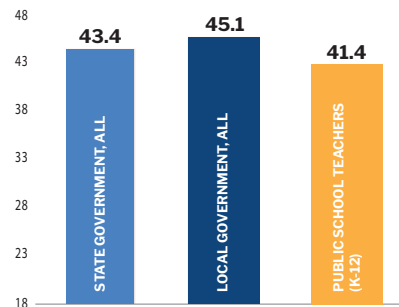

## PERCENTAGE WHO ARE FEMALE



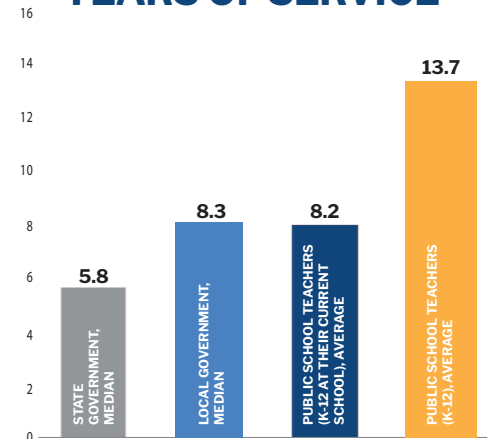
